• Adolescents may find that it is difficult to express their grief when a pet dies as they may feel embarrassed. Talking to your child in an open and honest way about the death of their pet is very important. Try to avoid telling your child that their pet has 'gone away' somewhere, as this may be confusing for them.

### **When a child loses a pet - The Trauma and Grief Network (TGN)**

Infant and toddler siblings of a sick or dying child can feel loss through: Absence of a parent or of a sibling due to the treatment or death of the sibling. Interruption to routine caused by the treatment or death of a sibling. Grief and stress of their parents or other family members.
