The Great Debate: Internationalists vs. Isolationists

Isolationists- Believed that the United states should isolate themselves from all other foreign conflicts, like the war Internationalists-Believed that the united States should actively work for peace, but not enter the war.

Isolationist, Interventionists, Internationalists - WORLD

Franklin D. Roosevelt's Lend-Lease proposal—first mentioned in a press conference on December 17, 1940 and presented in greater detail in his January 1941 State of the Union Address—sparked a massive debate over foreign policy, pitting "internationalists" against "isolationists."

Lesson 4: The Great Debate: Internationalists vs

Judges and debaters can role play as FDR, his cabinet members, Lindbergh, etc., if they wish. The pro-isolationists then have 2 minutes to make a case. They will then be questioned for 15 minutes by the internationalists, who then have 2 minutes to state their case and undergo questioning by the isolationist camp.

Isolationism vs. Internationalism/Interventionism The Basics

The isolationists wanted to avoid being mired in foreign intrigues, wars, and crises. The internationalists argued that without involvement, the world would evolve in ways that lacked US influence and thus threatened its national security.

Isolationists limited the nation's concerns to matters at home and at best in the Americas, and internationalists asserted that American concerns were universal, i.e., wherever mankind might be oppressed or in danger of aggression.
